
Bob Taylor - Minneapolis Piston Popper - 1966

Some of us (who aren't kids anymore) remember Piston Popper Bob Taylor from the '60s. Here he's pictured on the front cover of the February, 1967 issue of Flying Models magazine with the P-51B Mustang he flew at the 1966 Nationals. The model had a wingspan of 37", weighed 4-1/2 pounds, and was powered by a SuperTigre .46.

The club had a few very good scale builders - OK, **craftsmen** - at the time.

Bob left the area in the late '60s or very early '70s, as I recall, to assume a position as editor of a newspaper in northern Minnesota. I was fortunate to purchase a Corsair with a Max .35 and throttle control as he "cleaned house". The model was a lot of fun for several years; touch and gos on both asphalt or grass were always crowd pleasers, and there was more than enough power for several consecutive loops. But I would have much


