

Hello All,

I stopped at the Westwood school today (Monday 22nd) to check on the progress on the underground sprinkler system installation. The flags were still scattered in our designated flying area. I went to the maintenance department, and found the head man, and had meeting/conversation with him, very nice guy.

He told me, as I was told weeks ago, that the sprinkler system was to be completed by now, however, he said that he had just talked to the contractor, and he promised to get back at it and possibly complete the installation as early as Wednesday.

The head of maintenance has given us permission to fly in the area (between the ball field and the school building) directly west of our designated area, until we can get our circle mown. Please be VERY CAREFUL in this area as it is fairly close to the building!

We are not authorized to fly anywhere else on the property, like the football field/track area. We are to be North of the tennis courts.

Also be aware of noise, try to fly your quieter planes, we want to keep our neighbors happy.

It looks as things are moving forward on our Ramsey site, we've been given some "green lights" by the State, but the next step will be to get the city of Ramsey land management department to agree to our use of the area. Tom Sontag and I will be in contact with them soon, as early as this week. Once that is accomplished, it will be back to the State.


